In Memoriam **Robert “Bob” Coffren**

Past Grand Knight, Past Faithful Navigator
December 31, 2013



Robert “Bob” Joseph Coffren, 89, of Annapolis, died December 31st at Anne Arundel Medical Center.

Born on August 13, 1924 in Washington, DC to the late Robert L. and Julia M. Coffren, Bob graduated from McKinley High School. After graduation, Bob went to work as an apprentice machinist for the Department of the Navy. In 1943, he enlisted in the U.S. Navy and served as a signalman second class, helping to transport U.S. troops to combat zones in Italy, France, and Belgium. In recognition of his service, Bob received the American Theater of Operation Ribbon, European Theatre of Operation Ribbon and Victory Ribbon. He was honorably discharged from the Navy in 1946.

Upon discharge, Bob went to work for the General Accounting Office. He continued his education after the military and graduated in 1950 from the Columbus University School of Accounting. That same year, Bob moved to the Department of the Air Force where he became the Deputy Finance Officer at Bolling Air Force Base. In 1959, he transferred to the Department's Directorate of Accounting and Finance where he remained until his retirement in 1978. Bob's federal career was recognized with the USAF Medal for Meritorious Civilian Service.

He joined the Knights of Columbus in 1963 and became the 5th Grand Knight of the Mother Seton Council #5381 in Lanham and Faithful Navigator of the Bishop Walsh Assembly in Oxon Hill. He was a member of the American Legion and Saint Mary's Catholic Church in Annapolis where he served as a Eucharistic Minister. Bob enjoyed baseball and golf; he was a member of the Bowie Golf and Country Club and MISGA for 30 years. He also enjoyed traveling, making visits to Spain, Bermuda, Hawaii, Canada, Mexico, and most of the United States.

New Survey Finds 84% of Americans Support Significant Abortion Restrictions

This includes nearly 6 in 10 of those who identify as strongly pro-choice



New Survey Finds 84% of Americans Support Significant Abortion Restrictions

More than four decades after the Supreme Court's decision in *Roe v. Wade*, the vast majority of Americans are still very uncomfortable with the reality of widespread abortion in the United States.

A new survey of Americans finds strong support for abortion restrictions – including among those who identify as “strongly pro-choice.” Eighty-four percent of Americans would limit abortion to, at most, the first three months of pregnancy, with 58 percent of strongly pro-choice Americans supporting such limits.

The Knights of Columbus/Marist Poll also found that almost three-quarters of Americans (74 percent) favor a ban on abortions after 20 weeks except to save the life of the mother, a majority of Americans (53 percent) believe life begins at conception, and more than 6 in 10 (62 percent) think abortion is morally wrong.

More than 8 in 10 Americans (84 percent) do not see the abortion debate as an all or nothing proposition, saying that laws can protect both the well-being of a woman and the life of the unborn.

Other key findings of the survey include:

- 80 percent support parental notification before a minor can obtain an abortion.
- 79 percent support a 24-hour waiting period prior to having an abortion.
- 76 percent oppose allowing abortions to be performed by non-doctors.
- 62 percent want to change laws to allow for some restrictions on abortion.
- 58 percent support showing a woman an ultrasound image of her baby at least a day before an abortion.
- 57 percent believe abortion does a woman more harm than good in the long run.
- 55 percent — including 6 in 10 Millennials (adults 18 to 32) — want continued debate on the abortion issue.

On a related note, the survey also found that more than 7 in 10 Americans (71 percent) also believe that freedom of religion should be protected above government laws.

“Four decades after *Roe v. Wade*, abortion remains at odds with the conscience and common sense of the American people,” said Knights of Columbus CEO Carl Anderson. “The American people understand that abortion is bad for everyone, and even those who strongly support abortion want it reduced significantly, so it is time that our lawmakers and our courts reflected this reality.”

This survey of 2,001 adults was conducted Dec. 10, 2013, through Dec. 15, 2013, by The Marist Poll and sponsored by The Knights of Columbus. Adults 18 years of age and older residing in the continental United States were interviewed by telephone using live interviewers. Results are statistically significant within ±2.2 percentage points. The error margin increases for cross-tabulations.


Come hear about all the exciting events and activities that are planned for the year.
